



2011-2012 FCCLA ADVISER ACADEMY APPLICATION

FCCLA is proud to offer the Adviser Academy—a five track certificate program open to any adviser with fewer than five years of experience including recent university graduates. Adviser Academy is divided into five tracks to be completed in a one- or two- year cycle. Participants are eligible for post-baccalaureate credits through Northwest Missouri State University. Graduates from Adviser Academy are recognized at the National Leadership Conference during the Adviser Recognition Session and will receive an FCCLA certificate of completion.

Track 1: Developing a Chapter Vision (Held in conjunction with National Leadership Conference)

Advisers will be introduced to the National Consultant Team, learn about FCCLA curriculum, tools and integrating FCCLA into the classroom.

Track 2: Using Legislation to Change the Classroom (Held in conjunction with Capitol Leadership)

Academy participants will be integrated into USA Training and receive training from a professional lobbyist on how to effectively take the FCCLA message to policymakers.

Track 3: Leading at School (Held in conjunction with National Cluster Meetings)

Academy participants will be trained to be effective leaders and communicators in their schools. Participants will learn to involve key stakeholders such as administrators and parents and gain visibility for FCCLA by gaining professional development experience.

Track 4: Remaining Relevant as a Chapter (Held in conjunction with National Leadership Conference)

In the 4th track, the cohort will be encouraged to add to their program of work they built in Track 1 by integrating new national programs and STAR events into their classrooms. This track will focus building and maintaining a healthy chapter by working with local media and making connections with business and industry leaders in their communities.

Track 5: Participating at the State Level

Over the two year period of completing the Adviser Academy participants will be required to build a strong relationship with their state adviser and participate in at least one state meeting (e.g. conduct a workshop).
