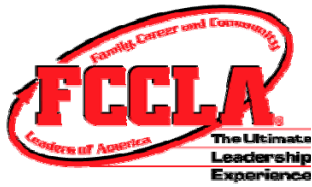

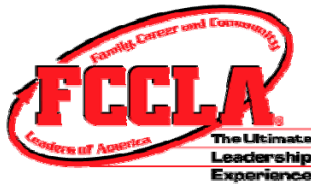

- Contact a non-existent chapter in an urban area about the possibility of chapter visit.

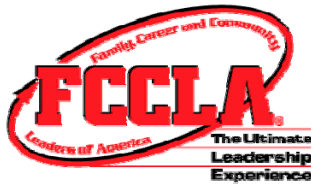

- Complete all my assignments for classes.

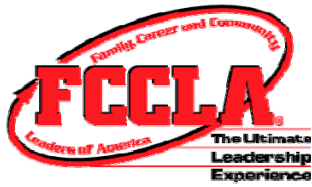

- Reach out to schools in the surrounding area, and help them boost up their membership and help them find local sponsors for their chapter.

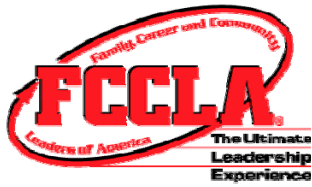
