GP Babb’s project, “Getting the FACTS on Teen Driving” was created to inform young adults in their community about teen driving and the associated dangers. Activities included creating visual presentations and a printed brochure and an interactive FACTS connection learning activity.

Mary Walker High
Washington

Mary Walker's project was supported by a \$4,500 grant from State Farm "Shift into Safety." The project focused on the dangers of distracted driving, specifically texting while driving. Activities included a simulated activity in which participants texted while driving tricycles, school-wide surveys on driving habits, posters, and classroom presentations.
