The FCCLA Community Service program guides students to develop, plan, carry out, and evaluate projects that improve the quality of life in their communities. Community Service helps young people build skills for family, career, and community roles; provides youth-centered learning experiences related to Family and Consumer Sciences education; and encourages young people to develop the positive character traits of trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring, and citizenship.

Through their projects, members experience character development and improve critical and creative thinking, interpersonal communication, practical knowledge, and career preparation. The program—

- helps young people build skills for family, career, and community roles
- provides youth-centered learning experiences related to Family and Consumer Sciences education
- encourages young people to develop the positive character traits of trustworthiness, respect, responsibility, fairness, caring, and citizenship

In addition to local and state projects, FCCLA implements a National Outreach Project, which is carried out across the nation. The goal of this project is to have each student get actively involved in making a difference by uniting together with the National Outreach Project. 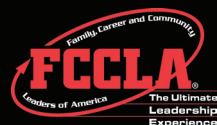
Awards
